As communication involves feelings (as well as opinions and other types of information) students perceived how different emotions are associated with certain colors. In a free drawing during Art, they used colors to express their feelings. Ms. Cantero was then able to have them write a good reflection interpreting the emotion perceived from the colors they had used in the drawings. They concluded that, indeed, there are feelings expressed in the way that we communicate and it is important to interpret the intention behind them (both the sender and the receiver in distinct types of communication). Interesting practice of analysis, expression, and communication!




