

RRIVAL AND



Congratulations to parents, students, and BV staff for the improvement in drop-off and pick-up of students achieved so far in this half month of transition with workers from two companies (in March we expect only RAE in fenced-in construction). As reminders of key processes:

1. Through the sticker gate (the one at the east) for pre-school students and their siblings:



- a. For arrival, the cars go around the roundabout and do not stop until the first one arrives at the 1st spot. When their car comes to a halt in the cue, and NOT BEFORE, the older ones can descend on their own. In the first three spots, custodians will help Montessori children out of the cars.
- b. At 7:18 am those who arrive late, drive in front of administration (roundabout closed).
- c. At dismissal, the cars go around the roundabout and stop for the older ones at the covered walkway and in front of Montessori for Montessori students. Cars yield to
- d. Buses and visitors access the parking lot by the first lane on the left.

- 2. Through the quick pass gate for the rest of the students.
 a. For arrival, cars do not have to go to respective zones, although only in zone 1 will there be three custodians helping the younger ones out. Please park where space is available but always very close to the sidewalk to allow other cars to drive by after dropping the students or when looking for space.
- b. For dismissal, cars stop in the respective areas, close to the sidewalk to allow cars that already picked up the students or are heading to their areas to go around the cue.
- **3. To enter or leave campus**, please apply the zipper system: EACH CAR that is leaving allows ONE car that is queuing at Calle Mangos to come in first. Courtesy is contagious!
- **4.** If frequently arriving more than 30 minutes late, we suggest that parents consider enrolling the children in after-school classes. Please take note that students have no special supervision assigned beyond half an hour after dismissal.

ACADEMIC NEWS


